

Entrance Testing

Prior to registration you will take the Tests of Adult Basic Education (TABE). The TABE test consists of reading, language and math and is used to determine class placement. Once in class, you will continue to test to monitor your progress.



Admissions Steps for Minors (16-17 year olds)

- Meet with admissions counselor
- Provide acceptable government ID.
- Provide a withdrawal from last school attended.
- Complete student application and GED® minor packet.
- Take TABE test to determine class placement.
- Complete online orientation video.
- Register for class
- Pay tuition and annual processing fees.
- Obtain class schedule and student identification.
- Student schedule and ID badge must be presented to instructor the first day of class.
